Operation Christmas Child

We will start collecting in January for Operation Christmas Child. For the **months of January and February,** we will be collecting bars of soap, plastic

soap cases, toothbrushes and toothbrush containers, and washcloths. There will be a box in the church's entry way for your items.

Operation Christmas Child started in 1993 through Samaritan's Purse to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to needy children around the world, and together with the local church worldwide to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. We will be collecting items during the year to put in a shoe box in November. The gifts are divided by boy or girl, and ages category: 2-4, 5-9, or 10-14. We also need to include \$10 donation per box to help cover the cost of shipping.

- 6. Volunteering as a Church in school events, helping local businesses, and reaching out to neighbors.
- 7. Make a prayer team called S.H.I.E.L.D.

What are your ideas? What good things are we already doing that we can be more invitational with or revamp? What are some old/new ideas you have for the Church? I want to know your thoughts and ideas. You matter. Your contribution matters. This is your Church as much as it is mines. Better yet, we are Christ's beloved Church. We matter. Our community matters, and they need the life that only we can bring to them.

We will be starting up meeting sometime in February. We are reorganizing since the blankets are now at Wilmot UMC. If you need blankets to work on, please let us know. Any questions contact Glenna Kisner.

AD COUNCIL MEETING—December 3rd

Council Ad Council met on December 3rd. Pastor is working with the Hispanic Caucus and Vital Merger and appreciates everyone doing their job. We delivered 585 blankets and since Calvary UCC closed, we moved all the supplies to Wilmot. A motion was approved to purchase a dehumidifier for the classroom. We shipped 158 boxes for Operation Christmas Child (OCC), and move the supplies to Wilmot. We will start collecting items in January. We will pack the cookies on December 8th. SPRC met with the Pastor on November 12th and reviewed how the Pastor is doing. A motion was approved to increase the pastor's salary by \$500 for 2024. We discussed the streaming of the worship service and suggest maybe music during quiet time like "Passing of the Peace" Our Christmas Eve service will be at 3:00 pm and Pastor would like some readers. The Joint Circuit 14 worship will be December 31st at Wilmot Fire Station with pizza and game following. On January 7th, we will take down the greens. The January Senior Fellowship will be Sweet Adeline. It was reported the pledges are over \$25,000 for 2024. We reviewed the October and November's treasurer's reports with the apportionments paid for the year. Living Waters made over \$1,200 from the Textile drive. At the Circuit 14 Thanksgiving Service \$135 and 129 pounds of food was donated to the Sharing Center. A motion to approve the 2024 budget of \$62,851.50. The Charge Conference will be December 3rd. The Vital Merger vote was scheduled for December 10th and only members can vote. We approved a motion to pay the Elder supervising the Special Charge Conference \$50 (He declined the money and suggest donating it to a local charity. We donated it to the Sharing Center.) Our next meeting will be Sunday, January 14th.

Highlights of Wilmot UMC 2023



We made over 585 blankets. We donated them to the Sharing Center,
 Shalom Center, Women's & Children Horizon, and Wheaton Francian Neonatal
 Unit. We also donated to the Royal Family Kids Camp for foster children and a

hospice program for youth. This was a joint project with Calvary United Church of Christ.

- We collected items for Operation Christmas Child. We packed 150 boxes. We shipped 158 boxes. them. This was a joint project with Calvary United Church of Christ.
- We offer a Community Senior Fellowship Program with guest speakers and programs followed by bingo, which averages 12 people each month. This is co-sponsored with Living Waters Ministries.
- A team of members from Wilmot UMC & Calvary UCC participate in a Relay for Life at Wilmot Union High School. Our team raised over \$13,700 for the American Cancer Society.
- We collect items to help the homeless move to their own place with the project "Shalom to Home. In 2023 we sent 2 kitchen kits, 3 bathroom kits, and 2 cleaning kits. We also gave many items we had collected that weren't full kits but did include 3 to 5 of some major items such as sets of dishes, laundry baskets, shower curtains, garbage cans, dish drainers with ice cube trays, measuring cups, and mixing bowls. We had assorted kitchen utensils, knives, dish towels, and potholders.
- Two Wilmot UMC members participated in the Royal Family Kids Camp (a camp for foster children).
 We help with raising funds for the camp. We also donated 50 blankets from our Blanket Bee.

Highlights of Living Waters Ministries

- Support to the Shalom Center in terms of Shalom to Home kits. Living Waters purchases items needed to complete a kit as necessary.
- Support to the Sharing Center in terms of cash gifts, clothing, food, books, etc. Special donation (\$500) for their 40th anniversary celebration.
- Monthly support checks to UMCOR (\$75 monthly)
- Support to our local school districts especially so during the covid crisis. We helped to fund meals
 and snacks for needy children, some clothing for the needy as well, playground equipment, school
 supplies, and the like trying to respond to the specific needs of each school
- Support for Senior ministry
- Support for Royal Kids Camp (\$500)
- Textile Drive that ultimately provides clothing and shoes to the needy in Milwaukee, the needy in third world countries, safe playground matting, and keeping useful things out of the refuse dump (2023 loaded a truck and a half. Received \$1,200)
- Funding to Tanzania for a bio-diesel project (\$500)
- Living Waters water for church functions, including Circuit worship gatherings
- Woodman's card sales, funded by Living Waters, provide 2.5% of sales back to constituent congregations
- Purchased a 360 degree microphone that was used for Vital Merger meetings and can be used by any church for zoom meetings
- Previous support Florida flooding, Ukraine refugees, and donation to Waukesha following Christmas
 Parade crisis.
- In past funded coffee shop drinks / refreshments when youth gathered with Pastor Beverly especially those returning from college for Thanksgiving & Christmas vacations
- We have available full scholarships to Christian Youth Camps when Circuit 14 youth want to attend.
- At the Joint Thanksgiving Service, we collected 129 pounds of food and \$135 for the Sharing Center.
